



## Supplemental Materials in ECS Journals

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### Supplemental Materials Policy

Article-relevant material that is costly, difficult, or impossible to include in the printed volume can now be made available online. Candidates for inclusion in this repository are figures that will not reproduce well in print, data sets, and multimedia. Supplemental Material must be cited or referenced within the paper so that the proper linking can be established.

### General Guidelines for Authors

ECS encourages authors to submit article-relevant, online-only supplementary material, such as figures that will not reproduce well in print, data sets, and multimedia. Supplemental material must directly supplement the material presented in the primary article. The article in turn must form a coherent whole that does not depend for comprehensibility on the online supplement. For example, an online-only dataset should flesh out but not replace explanations or conclusions in the printed article. Think of this Web-accessible material as directly supportive but not primary.

### Size Limitations

Supplemental material must not exceed a total of 10 Megabytes.

### Preparation Guidelines for Authors

Supplemental Material must be submitted in a document format, and must be presented as a coherent stand-alone text, referencing the paper it is attached to and including sufficient explanatory text to allow adequate understanding of the material presented. This means that all Supplemental figure files, tables, and datasets must be embedded within a document file such as a Word or PowerPoint file. Single files with no explanatory text will not be considered for online publication.

### Submission Guidelines for Authors

- The intent to submit Supplemental Material must be stated within the Cover Letter included in a new manuscript submission.
- Authors must first complete their manuscript submission, then send the Supplemental Materials to the ECS Editorial Office, referencing the Manuscript Number received during the submission of the main article. Materials may be sent to [JES@electrochem.org](mailto:JES@electrochem.org) or [ESL@electrochem.org](mailto:ESL@electrochem.org).
- Supplemental Material must be submitted to the ECS Editorial Office within 72 hours of submission of the technical article so that it may be included in the peer-review process. No exceptions to this requirement will be granted.

### Supported File Types

- Document files (.doc, .pdf, .txt). Please note, .dvi files will be converted to .gif files.
- Graphics (.gif, .jpg, .ps, or .tif)

### Unacceptable File Types

We do not support executable files of any kind. This includes Java applets and streaming media files.



### **Maintenance Guidelines**

AIP will keep materials in its system as long as practical within the limits of their resources. In a situation where we are forced to remove data, we will remove older and/or exceptionally large files first. Please maintain updated copies of your supplemental material among your own file backups. ECS will not revise or update Supplemental Material after the initial online publication.

### **Calling Out Supplemental Material**

Text in the printed volume should refer to Supplemental Material as follows:

"Follow the Supplemental Material link in the online version of this article"

Example:

"...are shown in Supplemental Table 1. See the Supplemental Material link in the online version of this article".
